

# 2020 Graduate Student Survey Report - All Respondents Prepared by Institutional Research and Decision Support Last Updated: September 21, 2020

**Administration**: The survey was administered between July 13, 2020 and August 10, 2020 to all graduate students (as of the spring 2020 census). Respondents were entered into a drawing to win 1 of 10 \$50 Amazon egift cards. Survey publicity and outreach was coordinated by IRDS with help from Graduate Division. The survey was promoted via emails to students.

**Response Rate**: Of the 684 students invited to complete the survey, 384 (56%) provided partial or complete responses. Because students could skip questions, response rates varied by question.

**Respondent Characteristics**: Please refer to Tables 1-3 below for respondent characteristics, including information about the representativeness of the respondent sample relative to the invitee population. The respondent sample was roughly representative of the invitee population. These tables are static and cannot be filtered.

#### Other Notes:

- Number of responses: Unless otherwise noted, respondents could answer each question on the survey; however, only certain respondents could complete some questions based on their prior responses or characteristics. Additionally, "not applicable" responses are not included in the tables and figures. See the question notes in this report and the survey instrument for more information. Additionally, respondents could skip questions. Thus, there will be discrepancies between the overall number of respondents and the number of respondents that answered particular questions.
- Free response questions: Free response question responses are not included in this report for several reasons. They require response coding to analyze, and coding schemes are often developed with a research question in mind. Additionally, in some cases free response data can inadvertently identify particular respondents who completed the survey, thus violating confidentiality. Interested parties should request these data from Dean Chris Kello or IRDS so that individual requests can be evaluated.











### How comfortable would you be reporting the activity?




















### How long does it typically take you to get to campus using CatTracks?



### There is a CatTracks stop within a 10-minute walk from where I live.





### I was able to find healthy food options.















# How likely are you to stay in your graduate program until you receive your ultimate degree objective?






















### Which Merced neighborhood did you live in this year? - Selected Choice









## How has your physical health been this past academic year?






